

OXYGEN THERAPY ADMINISTRATION - FAA LEVEL 3 AWARD (RQF)/ LEVEL 6 AWARD IN SCOTLAND (SCQF)

This course is suitable for qualified First Aiders, Emergency First Aiders, dental practitioners and dental care professionals and others working in an environment where oxygen is available for casualty welfare. This training enables users to administer oxygen safely and effectively, for casualties with breathing difficulties. Delegates will learn how and when to administer oxygen to a casualty and the safety concerns with carrying, storing and administering it.

SYLLABUS

This course is made up of practical and theoretical sessions delivered by the instructor who will provide a detailed course programme. At the end of the course, learners will be able to:

- Explain benefits of the oxygen therapy
- Explain contraindications prohibiting use of oxygen
- Explain dangers of using compresses gas
- Outline health and safety rules for the use-, storage- and handling of oxygen
- Carry out operational checks in preparation for use of oxygen therapy equipment
- Identify when oxygen therapy is required
- Administer oxygen using the required flow rate for the following oxygen delivery devices: non rebreather mask; bag, valve and mask
- Administer oxygen to a patient in line with agreed ways of working

CLASSROOM-BASED TRAINING

Max number of participants: 12.

Minimum age of the delegate: 16 to qualify. ID required.

Duration: 1 day (Guided Learning Hours: 6 hours; Total Qualification Time: 7 hours).

Certification: The qualification is assessed by the instructor using a range of methods, including practical and questioning (open and multiple-choice. The certification is valid for 3 years. Annual refresher is recommended, please ask for more details.
